### **Health Pathways Expansion Grant RFP Release**

A collaborative effort to expand health services for people experiencing homelessness led by California Community Foundation and the United Way of Greater Los Angeles, with investment support from Cedars-Sinai, L.A. Care Health Plan, and Providence.

- 1. <u>Eligibility</u>: Non-profit health care providers that operate in LA County and have already expanded OR have immediate plans to expand the level of non-COVID health services provided to PEH at shelter or through street-based services.
- 2. Award: Up to \$150,000 in one-time funding; 12% indirect
- 3. <u>Use</u>: Sustain, expand, or establish health services, in partnership with one or more homeless service providers, to meet the non-COVID health needs of PEH in LA County.
- 4. <u>Evaluation</u>: Awardees will participate in an evaluation to capture lessons and impact of the overall grant program








### **COVID-19 Situation Update**

#### Census Across COVID-19 Homeless Services Sites



#### **Confirmed Cases among PEH**

- 515 cases
- 71 Hospitalized (14%)
- 16 Deaths (3.1%)

#### **PRK**

 One new site has been added since our last meeting [15 sites have health partners and 2 sites are pending]

#### **MSEP**

- All sites have medical partners but are closed to new registrations
- Trailers remain open for new clients

#### Isolation/Quarantine

Bell Gardens and Mayfair sites have been decommissioned

#### **Unsheltered**

 Rate of infection among the unsheltered is increasing (currently 40% of positive cases among PEH, up from 35% in early June)

## Major headlines from the PIT Count

- Homelessness went up almost everywhere in southern California, (in part because we are getting better at counting)
  - 13.6% increase in the City of Los Angeles (16% last year)
  - 12.7% increase is the County of Los Angeles (12% last year)
- Black people continue to be overrepresented
- Inflow has increased and continues to outpace outflows
  - We place more people than ever into supportive housing
- The sheltered population increased by 3-5 percentage points
  - Shelter has increased even more since COVID-19



## Integration Insight #1 from the PIT Count

Homelessness among seniors age 62+ increased by 20%, and this trend is expected to continue.

### **Opportunity in Homeless Services**

As COVID-19 is creating a natural opportunity to increase focus on the older adult population, how are we increasing the supply of accessible units and in-home supports?

### **Opportunity in Health Services**

Since homeless seniors are often the highest-cost health care patients, how are they being engaged in routine primary care to get their health care managed?



## Integration Insight #2 from the PIT Count

58% more people meet HUD's definition of chronic homelessness, which can be the gateway to housing.

### **Opportunity in Homeless Services**

How is the homeless services system making sure health care encounters with our clients count toward their time-based chronicity calculations?

#### **Opportunity in Health Services**

How is the health care system making sure they are getting more people engaged and diagnosed to benefit the disabling conditions aspect of chronicity?



## Integration Insight #3 from the PIT Count

Black people are 4x more likely to be homeless than members of other race and ethnicity groups.

### **Opportunity in Homeless Services**

How are we making sure black people have access to shelter, outreach, mobile services, and the coordinated entry system? How are we decriminalizing homelessness?

#### **Opportunity in Health Services**

How are we ensuring black residents have disproportionate access to health coverage, and can easily access competent health care that can prevent and end homelessness?



## Integration Insight #4 from the PIT Count

24% of newly homeless residents cited a disabling health condition as the primary cause of their homelessness. (3rd leading cause)

### **Opportunity in Homeless Services**

How do we put prevention resources at the front door of our system upon first onset of disabling conditions?

#### **Opportunity in Health Services**

How do we leverage the first diagnosis as a "housing is healthcare" intervention point? How is coordination with mental health and substance use services?
