

## **COVID-19 Situation Update**



#### **Confirmed Cases among PEH**

- 1.260 cases
- 181 Hospitalized (14%)
- 31 Deaths (2.46%)
  - o 23% for those age 65+

#### **PRK**

- 36 sites serving ~4,100 clients
- One site in SPA 1/Antelope Valley has been added since we last met
- 4 sites expected to close by end of August

#### **MSEP**

- 4 shelter sites serving 240
  - o 0 sites under quarantine
- 6 trailer sites serving 276 clients

#### Isolation/Quarantine

4 sites serving 177 clients

#### **Unsheltered**

 Rate of infection among unsheltered PEH is the same as those in shelter (~37%)

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## **PRK Ramp Down Update**

- Sites will be ramped down over 7 month period (August 2020 February 2021) aiming for 2 month notice for providers at sites selected to ramp down. Providers will be asked to stop new intakes 6 weeks prior to site closure.
- Decisions on which sites will close in October will be made in early August; providers will be notified once decisions are made
- All sites within the city of LA are set to close by end of December 2020
  - Only those sites in county ESG funded areas are planned to carry over into early 2021;
     cities with their own ESG grants are excluded: Glendale, Pasadena, Long Beach, El
     Monte, Los Angeles
- Closures within SPAs will be coordinated so that no SPA region has all PRK sites closed in a single month





## Closing the Loop - COVID Recovery Plan

- LA County: LAHSA Recovery Re-Housing Services RFI
  - i. Creates two new categories within "permanent housing" for PEH that are at high risk of COVID (e.g. "PRK eligible" PEH) with mid or high range of acuity
  - ii. Supports eligible PEH with time-limited rental assistance
  - iii. RFI closes August 26
- 2. LA City: A Bridge Home
  - i. **+800** ABH beds are coming online throughout city of LA, marking the biggest addition of ABH beds in the initiative's history up till now
  - ii. Outreach teams encountering challenges filling up beds due to PEH confusion over PRK vs. ABH beds



## Los Angeles County Payer and Provider Relationships for Adult Medi-Cal Physical Health, Mental Health (MH) and Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Services



### Behavioral Health & Homeless System Integration

#### **Mental Health & Substance Use Disorder System**

- Within the LA County Health System, there are different providers and funding sources depending upon the service that is needed.
- Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder services are delivered by county agencies (DMH, DPH/SAPC), and by private hospitals, health centers and medical providers.
- Collaboration is needed to ensure both the physical and behavioral health needs of persons experiencing homelessness (PEH) are met
- Whole Person Care (WPC) and Health Homes (HHP) are two Medi-Cal programs that focus on care coordination of both physical and behavioral services, and also housing navigation among other things. PEH are one of the eligible populations for these programs.

#### **Homeless Service System**

- Measure H Strategy B7: Interim/Bridge Housing for people exiting institutions such as:
  - Hospitals
  - Long-term substance use treatment centers
  - Jail, prison, juvenile detention
- DMH & DHS housing resources for PEH with mental health, physical health needs
  - Interim Housing
  - Supporting services
  - Enriched residential care programs (Adult Residential Facilities, Skilled Nursing Facilities etc.)
