

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COVID-19 Situation Update



Confirmed Cases among PEH

- 1,436 cases
- 187 Hospitalized (13%)
- 33 Deaths (2.3%)
 - 73% of deaths are age 50+

PRK

- 38 sites serving ~4,300 clients
- One site in SPA 2/Studio City has been added since we last met
- 5 sites expected to close in August & September

CITY SITES

- 2 ABH sites have opened since last meeting and one more expected in Sept.
- 4 shelter sites serving 138
 - 0 sites under quarantine
- 6 trailer sites serving 238 clients

Isolation/Quarantine

• 4 sites serving 177 clients

Unsheltered

• Rate of infection among unsheltered PEH is now lower that those in shelter (~27%)



PRK Ramp Down Update

- Sites will be ramped down over 7 month period (August 2020 February 2021) aiming for 2 month notice for providers at sites selected to ramp down. Providers will be asked to stop new intakes 6 weeks prior to site closure.
- Sites with a date set for decommission:
 - The Garvey Inn (SPA 3)
 - Quality Inn & Suites (SPA 3)
 - Motel 6 (SPA 3)
 - Quality Inn Lomita (SPA 8)
 - Best Western Plus South Bay (SPA 8)

Key Integration Questions:

- Which sites are closing first?
- Where are residents going when the sites close?





Project Homekey Update

The State has dedicated \$600M to support property acquisition.

LA will receive at least \$160M but could receive more depending on demand and competition.

Decisions expected in September.

HPE Evaluation

- The United Way of Greater LA, in collaboration with California Community Foundation and other health funding partners, seek to find a research partner for an evaluation of the Health Pathways Expansion (HPE) program. The HPE program provides funding for health service providers to serve people experiencing homelessness (PEH) where they are in order to improve their health and well-being, including facilitating a pathway to housing.
- This 10-month evaluation seeks to address the impact of the investment on the client's outcomes, the challenges and strengths of the model, and feasibility of replicating/scaling. This research should focus on the system and the model provided by the funding, as opposed to individual grantee assessments and an overall grant evaluation.
- The Homeless Policy Research Institute at the USC Sol Price Center for Social Innovation is managing the RFP process. The RFP will be released August 28th with proposals due on September 25th. Please reach out to Victoria Ciudad-Real with any questions: vciudadr@price.usc.edu

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Unsheltered COVID-19 Testing Strategy





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- DHS conducting testing of staff and clients every **2 weeks**
- DHS will begin **training** staff to conduct nasal swab tests
- If an **outbreak** were to occur, testing of all residents and staff will occur weekly until the outbreak is cleared
- Wellness checks happening twice daily
- Temperature checks happening for staff/clients when entering the building
- If a client is exhibiting symptoms or tests positive, they are referred to the County's Quarantine and Isolation site for **quarantine**
